Promoting Safeguarding across Fountaindale:

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Safeguarding themes are embedded throughout the curriculum, including online safety, healthy relationships, personal safety, wellbeing and recognising trusted adults. Regular safeguarding information is shared with parents and carers through the weekly Headteacher newsletter. Safeguarding newsletters and communications are periodically dedicated to specific safeguarding themes and current issues. Visual safeguarding messages are displayed throughout the school, including posters in reception areas, corridors, classrooms and pupil toilets. Whole-school safeguarding campaigns are used to promote key messages and encourage discussion among pupils, staff and families. Positive relationships and a strong culture of openness encourage pupils to speak up if they are worried or need support. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff receive regular safeguarding updates through email communications, including signposting to resources, guidance and current safeguarding concerns. Safeguarding training is delivered through smaller, regular training sessions and bite-sized learning opportunities throughout the year. All staff receive safeguarding updates in response to emerging risks, local issues and national guidance. Pupil voice activities through Rights Respecting School Council provide opportunities for children and young people to share their views, experiences and feelings about safety and wellbeing. Safeguarding assemblies reinforce key messages and help pupils understand how to keep themselves safe. Safeguarding is a standing item in staff meetings, governor meetings and leadership discussions. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Online safety is regularly promoted to pupils, staff and parents through workshops, awareness campaigns and information sharing. Safeguarding information is readily available on the school website, including policies, procedures and contact details for safeguarding leads. Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) information is clearly displayed around school so pupils, staff and visitors know who to contact with concerns Visitors, volunteers and contractors receive safeguarding information and expectations when entering the school. |
